I do believe that Sumo World is occasionally on sale inside the Ryogoku Kokugikan, although not every basho. I get conflicting messages from the magazine vendors about when they will actually receive copies of the magazine.

It is a shame that Eurosport pulled the plug on sumo as it used to be shown regularly until the mid-2000s, meaning you could have easily watched it in France.

The main sumo coverage in the

media appears to be on the Sumo Association website, which does show live matches over the internet. This will, of course, involve getting up early in the morning in France, but it should be interesting enough. I am not aware of any live TV coverage outside of Japan, apart from in countries which can pick up the NHK wavelength. (Not France).

As for similar magazines, well, we'll always do our best with Sumo Fan Magazine, and — will try earnestly to get our efforts into print someday. There are many Japanese sumo publications available in bookshops in Japan, so if you do come here, please buy as many as you can. They're pretty cheap - no more than six euros.
